#### **MMWR Discusses Serial Testing of Individuals in Correctional and Detention Facilities**

The June 29 issue of CDC's Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report (MMWR) discusses the value of serial testing among quarantined contacts of patients with COVID-19 in a correctional facility in Louisiana. The testing identified a high proportion of asymptomatic and presymptomatic cases that were not identified through symptom screening alone. Approximately one fourth of cases were found through serial testing during quarantine. Early detection and isolation of persons with COVID-19, along with testing of close contacts, can slow the transmission of SARS-CoV-2 in correctional facilities. Rapidly identifying and isolating infected people is important to reduce spread. For more information, see 6.29 MMWR.
