The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2025 tax year that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for EDWARDS COUNTY from the same properties in both the 2024 tax year and the 2025 tax year.

(preceding tax year) (current tax year)

The voter-approval tax rate is the highest tax rate that EDWARDS COUNTY may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate.

(name of taxing unit)

The proposed tax rate is greater than the no-new-revenue tax rate. This means that EDWARDS COUNTY is proposing to increase property taxes for the 2025 tax year.

(current tax year)

A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED TAX RATE WILL BE HELD ON 08/26/2025 08:00 AM at Edwards County Courthouse, 100 E Main Street, Rocksprings, TX.

The proposed tax rate is not greater than the voter-approval tax rate. As a result, EDWARDS COUNTY is not required to hold an election at which voters may accept or reject the proposed tax rate. However, you may express your support for or opposition to the proposed tax rate by contacting the members of the Edwards County Commissioners Court of EDWARDS COUNTY at their offices or by attending the public hearing mentioned above.
